Cemetery location: 3751 Market Street (south side),

San Diego, CA. Park inside the cemetery or on Market Street.

Meet outside the Business Office, 1/10th mile inside the gate on the left.

Mount Hope was founded in 1869. The cemetery's name was selected by Augusta Barrett Sherman, whose husband Matthew Sherman was founder of Sherman Heights, location of the magnificent Villa Montezuma Museum.

Get in a Halloween/Dia de los Muertos mood with this 2-hour walk. Visit the final resting places of important San Diego Victorians like the Shermans, Alonzo Horton, Kate Sessions, Elisha Babcock, and George Marston.

See the grave markers of Civil War veterans and even a California governor.
